Position Description

The Department of Design at San José State University invites applications for a tenure-track Assistant Professor position in Graphic Design, beginning in Fall 2026. This is a nine-month, academic-year appointment. We seek an innovative designer and scholar whose research, creative practice, and teaching engage with two or more of the following areas: design fundamentals, systems design, social design, critical and/or speculative design, computational approaches to design, and the integration of emerging technologies into design practice. Candidates should be prepared to teach design fundamentals and emerging tools for design processes—including Artificial Intelligence (AI), generative design, and data-driven creativity—primarily at the undergraduate level. Research related to emerging visualization technologies is highly desirable, and industry or consulting experience is welcomed.

The <u>Department of Design</u> is committed to design, research, and scholarship at the highest level. The department is centered around creative technologies and we are looking for faculty who are seeking to use technology in adaptive, inclusive, poetic, collaborative, and experimental ways. We are also socially responsible, we strive to make design accessible and equitable, and we have a culturally engaged vision of design across our programs. The department offers four professional degrees and is organized around five discipline groups: Interior Design, Industrial Design, Interaction Design, Graphic Design, and Animation. Our faculty includes designers, architects, artists, and historians committed to excellence and collaboration extensively across the Department, College, University, Silicon Valley, and beyond.

The Department of Design and San José State University value inclusive excellence and are committed to advancing equity through research, teaching, and service. We enroll nearly 40,000 students, many of whom are historically underserved; approximately 45% of our undergraduate students are first-generation college students and 38% are Pell Grant recipients. In addition, we are both a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI) and an Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander Serving Institution (AANAPISI). SJSU aspires to create holistic learning environments that facilitate both individual and collective transformation. We seek teacher-scholars who cultivate inclusive, empowering spaces for mutual learning, skill-building, and knowledge exchange for all students. Our commitment to lifelong learning supports meaningful connections among faculty, staff, students, alumni, and the broader communities we serve.

Required Qualifications

- A terminal degree (MFA, MDes, PhD) in graphic design or related fields is required. The degree
 must be completed before the targeted start date.
- At least five years of professional experience in research or design practice in graphic design.
- A demonstrable body of work (portfolio) that exhibits excellence in design that is relevant to graphic design.
- Applicants must demonstrate an awareness of and sensitivity to the educational goals of a socially and economically diverse student population as might have been gained in cross-cultural study, training, teaching, and other comparable experiences.
- University level teaching experience.

Preferred Qualifications

Priority will be given to candidates who possess two or more of the following:

- Expertise in the use of emerging tools and technologies in visualization (i.g. artificial intelligence, machine learning, generative AI) to creative problem-solving (significant projects/research).
- Candidates should be able to teach at all levels (both lower division and upper division courses)
 in graphic design (e.g., basic 2D design, typography, digital software for graphic design, motion
 design, and interaction design) and demonstrate the ability to interact and collaborate with
 colleagues in a multidisciplinary and cross-disciplinary environment.
- A track record of success, or demonstrated potential for success, conducting research or creative activity relevant to the position that results in recognition (e.g., projects/research that have been published, exhibited, or received awards).
- Potential for collaboration across disciplines within the Department of Design and at the college
 and University levels. We believe such collaborations create a charged atmosphere for study and
 a critical edge for research, and we seek candidates who can thrive within this context.
 Applicants should consider how their work might connect with the college's Public Programming Opportunities.
- The potential to attract industry collaboration, funding, and sponsorship.



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Key Responsibilities

- The candidate will be responsible for teaching undergraduate classes in graphic design including design fundamentals/visualization and other program-related topics; and undergraduate/graduatelevel classes on emerging technologies both within the department and broadly within the college.
- Effectiveness in teaching assignments, research, scholarly, creative activities, and department/college/university service are all required to achieve tenure and promotion.
- The candidate will provide academic advising to students.
- The candidate will participate in shared governance, usually in department, college, and university committees and other service assignments.
- The candidate must demonstrate awareness and experience in understanding the needs of a student population of great diversity—in age, abilities, cultural background, ethnicity, religion, economic background, primary language, sexual orientation, gender identity, and academic preparation—through inclusive course materials, teaching strategies, and advisement.

Other Duties

Note that all San José State University employees are considered mandated reporters under the California Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act and are required to comply with the requirements set forth in CSU Executive Order 1083 as a condition of employment. Pursuant to the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act (Clery Act) and CSU systemwide policy, some faculty duties may lead to designation as a Campus Security Authority (CSA). CSAs are required to complete Clery Act training and to immediately report Clery incidents to the institution.

Faculty employees must complete CSU employee training as assigned and required based on their role (e.g., Data Security, FERPA, Preventing Discrimination and Harassment, Title IX, Health and Safety). The work for this faculty position is located in the State of California and requires commuting to the campus.
